An apprenticeship snapshot for Wiltshire



This newsletter was produced by the Employment and Skills Service at Wiltshire Council to showcase employers, providers and the range of opportunities available through the apprenticeship route.

Apprenticeships in Wiltshire

Wiltshire saw 5720 apprenticeships started between August 2017 and July 2018.

The parliamentary constituency of Devizes which includes the towns and villages of Durrington, Market Lavington, Marlborough, Pewsey and Tidworth accounted for 1820 of these starts across all sectors and levels.



Starts for the first three quarters of this academic year (August to April) show continued apprenticeship growth with a total of 4290 starts recorded for Wiltshire; 1290 of which were across the Devizes constituency.

An alternative to university!

Higher and Degree level apprenticeships are an area of rapid growth and offer a real alternative to university for applicants and not just for those that live in large cities such as London, Bristol and Birmingham. There are some great opportunities across Swindon and Wiltshire from businesses such as Arla Foods, Bew & Co, Hartham Park, Siemens and Zircon Software.

Applications for these programmes often open well in advance of the job starting, usually between October and March to start the following September. It is therefore important to sign up to the Find an Apprenticeship service website where you can opt in to receive alerts as vacancies are announced based on your criteria or location.

Apprenticeship Reforms – What's new?

Fire It Up campaign

The Department for Education's apprenticeships campaign 'Fire It Up' is once again live. It is already showing positive results since its launch in January, with a 10% increase in young people's consideration of apprenticeships.

The second phase of the campaign continues to target broad audiences such as young people and parents but will also focus activity on those audiences that contribute to widening participation in apprenticeships such as those from disadvantaged backgrounds, women in under-represented sectors, low paid workers, people with learning difficulties or disabilities and people from ethnic minority backgrounds.

Look out for the adverts on TV, cinema, out of home poster sites, digital and social media.


